MESSAGES OF THANKS FROM YOUR SCHOLARS



Vincent Gerald P. Orpiano 3rd Year Medicine FEU-NRMF

My willingness to pursue Medicine started when I was working as a medical technologist in a government hospital. By that time, I was supposed to finish my two-year working experience as a requirement to work abroad. I had finished a regular six-month internship and another six months externship requirement, taken and passed the international board exam for medical technology and had worked over a year. Almost everything had been finalized.

But one day at work, I realized that I was not happy with what I was doing so I asked myself "Is this really what I want?". I then remembered the time my father asked me what I wanted to pursue. I only had one thing on my mind and that was to help other people, so I envisioned myself becoming a doctor. It made me feel alive. I knew then and there that being a doctor was my calling. Just thinking about how I could help people made me ecstatic. I discussed it with my father and surely, he supported me every step of the way. He sold our land in the province to provide for my dream but unfortunately it was not enough, so I decided to work again for another year to help in paying for my future expenses in medical school.

During Medical School I was lucky enough to meet the required grade for partial scholarship (second semester of first year and first semester of second year). Unfortunately, our family had another financial crisis and I needed to pay half of my tuition fee. I have two other siblings, a sister recently graduated and about to take the board exams and the youngest sister as an incoming senior high. Our only source of income was my father's salary managing a small dormitory (15,000PHP a month) and a small computer shop inadequate to pay all school expenses. I had no other option so I decided to give way and stop my studies for a while.

When I applied for a leave of absence from the Deans office, Dean delos Reyes advised me to apply for a financial grant at FEUDNRSMAF. The Committee was able to solicit funding from the Northern Texas Chapter of which an FEU-NRMF alumnus Dr. Aliyas⁶⁶ is a member and I was able to continue with my studies because of their generosity.

With perseverance I finished the semester and ranked top 4 in our batch. I was then promoted to being a Foundation scholar and received additional funding to support my studies through the Drs Roy & Cita Cabrera Endowed Scholarship Fund. And then COVID 19 came and our small computer shop was forced to close and my father had difficulties going back to work because of his comorbidities. I was then forced to take over managing the dorm and became a working student.

Life became more challenging but with the support of a financial grant given by the US based FEUD-NRSMAF Class 1966, it greatly eased my journey as a medical student. I will always be grateful for the opportunity and generosity of the Foundation that has been generously given to me. I promise to do my best and finish with honor and soon be able to serve my own countrymen.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM - FEUDNRSMAF: Hernani Tansuche MD, Class 68, Chair FEUDNRSMAF Scholarship & Student Achievement Awards Committees

Section F, Section 1 Article IV of the FEUDNRSMAF (Foundation) By-Laws states: "To establish grants, chairs and scholarship awards to members of faculty and students of the Medical school". In line with this proviso, the Foundation im-

plemented Section F to establish the Endowment Fund (Professorial Chair Awards) in the 80s. Other grants include the Faculty awards for the senior and junior faculty (basic and clinical depts) and Faculty Incentive awards.

The late Arsenio Martin⁶⁷ personally funded the Most Outstanding Faculty Award selected by the student body and was joined later by Dr. Manuel Malicay⁷². This award is now named after Dr. Malicay and continues to this day. There is also a Teaching Resident Award initially funded by the late Dr.Virgilio Pilapil⁶² and presently called Drs. Licerio⁷³ and Daisy⁷³ Castro Award.

The Student Achievement Awards (SAA) are given to students from the first to third year levels, including the most outstanding student at the 1st, 2nd and 3rd year levels and most outstanding student from first to third year level. Foundation scholars were recipients of most of these latter awards in the past 3 years.

In the past several decades FEU-NRMF has offered academic scholarships to students based on their GWA (graded weighted average) and financially-needy students were given financial grants by individual alumni members. The latter scholars applied with the FEU-NRMF Medical Dean or to the Foundation through the Executive Director (the late Dr. Cesar Reyes⁶⁸⁾. Dr. Reyes would then seek financial assistance from generous alumni members. In the late 2004, Sen Martin as a BOT member recruited two students from San Beda College as lateral entries into the program. During the term of Dr. Amante Legaspi⁶⁸ as Chairman in 2006, he funded the program with proceeds from a raffle drive during the annual reunions and appointed Dr. Daisy Ramos⁶² as Chair . Since then the raffles have been an annual staple of the national reunions and have been successful in generating funds for the program with the same Chairwoman at the helm of the Committee.

Dr. Martin continued recruiting scholars for the school during his term as President and Chairman of the Board. In 2012, the Foundation created the Scholarship Committee and Dr. Martin was appointed Chair until his passing in 2013. The GWA is used as a basis of a student's scholarship eligibility for both academic scholar and the Foundation scholar. The full academic scholar's tuition is 100%-funded by FEU-NRMF, and the Foundation defrays the miscellaneous fees, stipend and yearly books costs. Rationale for the additional monetary benefits is to be more competitive with the other medical schools in attracting the brightest to enroll at FEU-NRMF. The Foundation splits the partial scholar's tuition fee with FEU-NRMF. In addition, the Foundation also pays for the miscellaneous fees and provides a stipend as well as a yearly book allowance.

In 2018, the Committee started accepting financially indigent students as grantees with funding solicited from alumni members. Last year the recipients were classified as Economic Hardship scholars. The Committee also started vetting the applicants and satisfying criteria attesting to their financial indigency. The Committee also implemented stringent criteria in maintaining status as full or partial scholars. In 2018 the Foundation treasurer (Dr. Cureg) also formulated a budget for the scholarship program and established an Endowment fund for Economic Hardship scholars with generous donations from The Drs. Roy⁶⁶ and Cita Cabrera Endowed Scholarship Fund and from Drs. Rene⁶⁸ and Aurora⁶⁷ Estrella.

Our efforts have paid off as evidenced by the performance of our scholars. The program has yielded impressive results . Since 2009 we had graduates placing in the top ten in the February and September PLE, some of which are Foundation scholars. Since 2018, all of our Foundation scholars have graduated with Latin Honors.

We take pride in the stellar performance of our scholars which extends beyond their graduation. We appreciate their expressions of gratitude towards the Foundation especially to their benefactors for helping them achieve their dreams of becoming a doctor. We take great satisfaction in their accomplishments and are proud that we all are graduates of FEU-NRMF. We are truly grateful for many alumni that have given generously to the Scholarship Program through the years.

The PRC (Professional Regulation Commission) released the Nov. 2020 Physicians Board Exam (PLE) with 3538 out of 4704 (75.21%) passed the exam.

While no FEU-NRMF graduate placed in the top 10, FEU-NRMF ranked #7 as top performing school with pass rate of 90.54% . FEU-NRMF ranked # 4 in 2019 and #10 in 2018.
