ANNUAL REUNION: The first Alumni Foundation reunion was held at Marriott Lincolnshire (IL) during the 1978 APPA Convention alumni night. The event was so successful that our alumni decided to meet again every summertime to renew friendship, reminisce about the past, honor outstanding classmates, and have our families meet new friends. The New Jersey Chapter hosted the next reunion at the Playboy Great Gorge Hotel. In 1980, the first annual reunion with a scientific seminar was held in Orlando. In the succeeding years, the affair was held in Anaheim 1981, Boston 1982, Grand Island in Niagara Falls (NY) 1983, Indian Lake Resort in Chicago 1984, Orlando 1985, Virginia Beach 1986, Toronto 1987, Long Beach 1988, St. Louis 1989, Washington (D.C.) 1990, Atlantic City 1991, San Francisco 1992, Chicago 1993, New Orleans 1994, Las Vegas 1995, Minneapolis 1996, Dallas 1997, Anaheim 1998, Atlantic City 1999, Chicago 2000, Las Vegas 2001, San Francisco 2002, Norfolk 2003, Troy (MI) 2004, Las Vegas 2005, Houston 2006, and Chicago 2007. The occasion has served as a venue not only to see our classmates, but also to present talents other than our medical expertise during the Filipiniana night and to plan activities for our annual reunion in West Fairview the following January.

SCIENTIFIC SEMINAR: Three comprehensive, accredited half-day programs that cover a broad spectrum of updates and current trends in medicine, designed not only for the primary practitioners but also for the specialists highlight the event. This continuing medical education activity has been planned and implemented with the Essential Areas and Policies of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME), co-sponsored by the Philippine Medical Association in Chicago which is accredited by the ACCME to provide continuing medical education meeting for physicians and takes responsibility for the content, quality, and scientific integrity of this CME activity. HONOREES: The honorees of the reunion in 2008 will be led by the members of the Class'58 Golden Jubilarians and Class'83 Silver Jubilarian. During the Grand ReunionSaturday dinner dance, the attending jubilarians are presented, first in slides the way they were in the medical school, then in person - the way they are now. The alumni night will recognize other honorees, namely: Class'63 Sapphire Jubilarians, Class'68 Ruby Jubilarians, Class'73 Coral Jubilarians, Class'78 Pearl Jubilarians, and Class'88 (20th anniversary), Class'93 (15th anniversary), and Class'98 (10th anniversary) celebrants. Members of these Classes are enjoined to attend in full force. If members of these Classes, or any Class, wish to have separate functions or to get together during the reunion, the Alumni Foundation will help with any arrangements. CLINICOPATHOLOGIC CONFERENCE

CLINICAL ABSTRACT

Chief Complaint: Fever, cough and dyspnea

History of present illness: A 19-year old female with no known medical issues and working at a local McDonald restaurant, complained of fever, cough, dyspnea, dizziness, and chest discomfort/pain worsening for two days. The patient was referred to Morris Hospital emergency room, found to be hypoxic, admitted to medical surgical floor, and subsequently transferred to the ICU. She was placed on BiPAP, then intubated, sedated, and started on Ceftriaxone, Azithromycin, and Bactrin DS intravenously. Chest radiograph showed diffuse bilateral lung infiltrates. The next day, she was placed on ventilator with assist control of 400, 100% O₂, and PEEP+10. Pressors and Xigris were also added.

Past medical history: noncontributory. **Social history:** She denied any tobacco, alcohol, and illicit drug use. She lived alone with three cats, two dogs, and a boyfriend who recently served in the military in Afghanistan. **Allergies:** none. **Medications:** Amoxillin one day earlier for bronchitis, Aleve, and Yasmin.

Physical findings: thinly built female, maximum temp 101.3° C, weight 110 lbs, 64-inch tall, respiration 24-25/min, heart rate 106/min, blood pressure 101 / $_{50}$, O_2 saturation 92-97% on 100% O_2 , anicteric sclerae, pale conjunctivae, 4-mm round pupils sluggishly light response, dehydrated nostrils, pink oral mucosa, no thrush, intubated and in place, central trachea, supple neck, no palpable lymph nodes, normal thyroid, no neck redness and distention, normal chest cage, precussion resonate, right breath sounds equal left, coarse breath sound in the lower zones, no wheeze or crackles, preserved air entry in all zones, normal S1-S2 heart sounds, no murmurs or bruits, mild abdominal distention soft to feel with no rebound or guarding, decreased bowel sounds, no cyanosis edema and clubbing, no skin rashes, and normal neurological and musculoskeletal evaluation.

Laboratory data: WBC 28100, neutrophils 93%, bands 3%, lymphocytes 1%, monocytes 2%, eosinophils 1%, Hgb 15.5, Hct 45.1 MCV 87.3, RDW 13.2, and platelets 210000. Blood gases: pH 7.43, pCO₂ 32, pO₂ 45, bicarb 21, and O₂ sat 82%. Electrolytes: Na 134, K 3.4, Cl 102, TCO₂ 25, BUN 9, creatinine 0.65, glucose 126, calcium 7.3, phosphorus 2, Mg 1.5, total bilirubin 0.44, direct bilirubin 0.18, AST 11, ALT 24, LDH 134, total protein 4.3, albumin 1.9, and alkaline phosphatase 50. Coagulation profile: PT 16.4, INR 1.4, PTT 33.8, D-dimer 2195. Lower extremity Doppler venous ultrasound: normal.

Chest radiographs and CT scan: bilateral alveolar consolidation, diffuse on both lung lobes and worse in the lower zones with possible small effusion; and normal heart/ mediastinum. EKG and echocardiogram: normal. Sputum analysis: moderate WBC, rare RBC, few epithelial cells, gram+cocci in chains (alpha-Streptococcus and Neisseria species). Urinalysis: normal. Urine culture, blood culture, pregnancy beta-HCG, cardiac enzymes, PPD tuberculin, ANA antinuclear antibody, cyclic citrullinated peptide, RPR for syphilis, HIV₁₋₂, Herpes simplex, Chlamydia pneumonia, Chlamydia trachomatis, Chlamydia psittaci, Legionella, Mycoplasma, Blastomyces dermatitidis, Histoplasma capsulatum, and Toxoplasma gondii tests negative.

A diagnostic procedure was performed.
