In the succeeding years, the affair was held in Anaheim 1981, Boston 1982, Grand Island in Niagara Falls (NY) 1983, Indian Lake Resort in Chicago 1984, Orlando 1985, Virginia Beach 1986, Toronto 1987, Long Beach 1988, St. Louis 1989, Washington DC 1990, Atlantic City 1991, San Francisco 1992, Chicago 1993, New Orleans 1994, Las Vegas 1995, Minneapolis 1996, Dallas 1997, Anaheim 1998, Atlantic City 1999, Chicago 2000, Las Vegas 2001, San Francisco 2002, Norfolk 2003, Troy MI 2004, Las Vegas 2005, Houston 2006, Chicago 2007, Orange County 2008, New York City 2009 and Troy 2010. The reunion has served as a venue not only to see our classmates, but also to present talents other than our medical expertise during the Filipiniana night and to plan activities for our annual reunion in West Fairview the following January.

CLINICO PATHOLOGIC CONFERENCE

CHIEF COMPLAINT. Severe low back pain

CLINICAL ABSTRACT. A 69-year old male complained of weakness and low back/ pelvic pain down into his legs. The pain started two weeks earlier, but came on suddenly two days prior to admission, when he was doing yard work. He was using some weed killer that leaked, which he just covered up with his hand. He denied chest discomfort and cough. He also had some mild urination problem and patchy numbness down the right thigh. Otherwise, he was asymptomatic. He denied upper extremity problem. At the ward, he got up one morning when his legs simply collapsed on him; he fell, and this was followed by right trochanteric pain. He felt his hip went out.

PAST HISTORY: Diabetes, hyperlipidemia, hypertension, right BBB, in 1985 lung TB nodule excised, in 1959 appendectomy, and grass allergy. Medications: Glyburide 2mg tid, metoprolol 25mg bid, Lantus 10U q am and 12U q pm, Carafate 1g qid, Zelia 10mg daily, and Flexeril 1 tablet tid.

PHYSICAL FINDINGS. Awake, alert, and nervous. T 98.2⁰F, pulse 68 per minute, respiration 18, blood pressure ¹⁸⁰/₈₄. Oriented to person, place and time. Pupils equal, round, and reactive to light and accommodation. No nystagmus. Facial sensation present. Symmetrical facial muscles. Hearing normal. Sclerae, external ear canals, tympanic membrane, oral cavity and pharynx normal. Supple neck, no lymphadenopathy. Lungs clear. Regular heart rhythm and rate. Slightly distended abdomen with active bowel sounds, and no palpable mass, or organomegaly, and no tenderness. No redness, swelling or warmth on the back. Percussion of posterior elements elicited no pain. No pain over the posterior pelvis either. No pain with compression of the pelvis. The hip was properly located. Some pain over the trochanter. No knee pain. Range of all joint motion normal. Peripheral pulses all strong and palpable. Cranial nerves II through XII intact. Motor 5/5 muscle strength with normal tone and bulk. Normal straight leg raising tests. Deep tendon reflexes 1+ biceps, triceps and brachioradialis, 2+ patellar ankle reflexes bilaterally with downgoing toes on plantar stimulation. Normal temperature and vibratory sensation. Normal gait. Flabby atrophy of both calves. Distal strength ⁴⁺/₅. Extension strength 4-5. Decreased sensation towards the anterior aspect of the thighs. Otherwise, the rest of the neurological examination results within normal.

LABORATORY DATA. WBC 12.2–19.5 with normal differential counts, RBC 4.28–4.35, Hgb 12, Hct 34.4–5.3, normocytic normochromic anemia, platelets 402–475; C-reactive protein 57; urinalysis glycosuria and trace protein; PT/ INR and PTT normal; blood gases results WNL; ESR 49-76; Na 131, K 4.6, Cl 94, CO₂ 26, Bun 13, Cr 1.15, glucose 227, calcium 8.3, T bilirubin 0.28, AST 37, ALT 112, T protein 7.4, albumin 2.8, Alb/globulin ratio 0.6; PSA 2.9 - 8.8; mixed lymphocyte neutrophil pleocytosis with 116 glucose and 67.5 protein in CSF and cytology; IgG 1860, IgA569, normal IgM; and normal rheumatoid factor titer, cyclic citrull peptide and ANA screen. A bone scan showed slight uptake in the mid-/ distal left humerus; but MRI did not reveal any endosteal erosions. For the elevated ESR, steroids was started with improvement.

CONSULTS: Oncology, urology, nephrology, rheumatology, neurology, infectious disease and orthopedic surgery suggested multiple myeloma, non-bacterial prostatitis, inappropriate antidiuretic hormone secretion syndrome, Guillain Barre syndrome, advanced fibromyalgia, rheumatoid arthritis, chronic fatigue syndrome, and polymyalgia rheumatica, respectively.
